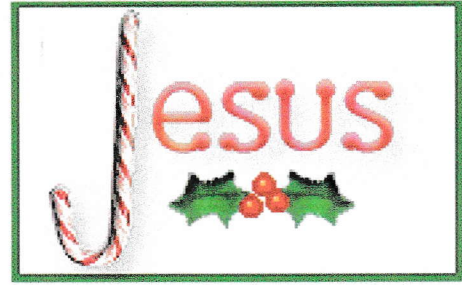

One large red stripe reminds us of the blood Jesus shed on the cross as payment for our sins to bring eternal life to all who believe.

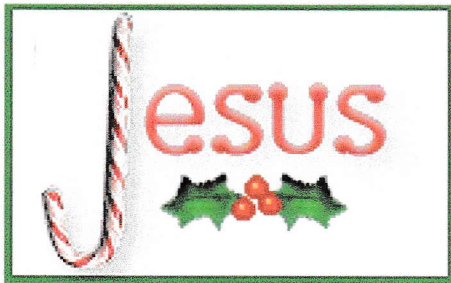

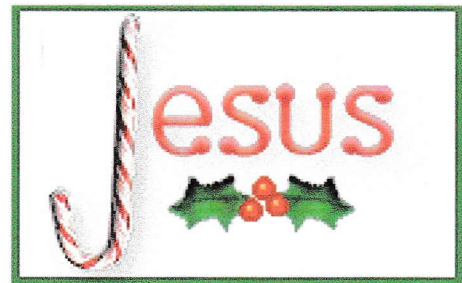
